Project Overview





What is the Crook County Transportation System Plan?

The Crook County Transportation System Plan (TSP) is a 20-year plan to address current and future transportation needs. Crook County is updating the existing TSP to address ongoing and anticipated transportation issues thoughout the County.

Crook County, in partnership with ODOT and the community, will update the 2017 TSP with an emphasis on improving connections and safety conditions for all travelers — including those who drive, walk, bicycle, use a wheelchair or cane, or deliver freight.

What will the TSP Address?

- Countywide transportation safety
- Planning for and safely accommodating new growth
- Access and safety in the Powell Butte and Juniper Canyon areas

TSP Goals

Goal 1: Mobility and Connectivity

Promote a transportation system that links rural communities to key destinations in the County, Prineville, and adjacent counties, and serves existing and future needs for transporting goods and people.

Goal 6: Planning and Funding

Maintain the safety, physical integrity, and function of the County's multimodal transportation network, consistent with Goal 6 of the OTP, which focuses on creating a transportation funding structure that serves

Goal 2: Economic Development

Plan a transportation system that supports existing industry, encourages economic development in the County, and responds to population growth in Crook County and adjacent communities.

Goal 7: Equity

Provide access to the transportation system for all users.

Significant population growth in Crook County has outpaced previous projections, placing growing demands on the transportation system.



Growth in Crook County has resulted in a gradual increase in traffic, speeding, and safety issues. Increased traffic leads to congestion and vehicle emissions.





The Prineville TSP is currently in development. Both TSPs will seek to coordinate and manage transportation needs across jurisdictional boundaries while promoting regional connections.

Approximately **86%** of respondents were concerned about not having another road into or out of Juniper Canyon.



Approximately **70%** of respondents were concerned about increased speeding, traffic, and illegal passing on Juniper Canyon Road and Davis Loop.



Subdivisions east of Juniper Canyon have limited connection to other areas of Crook County.
