WORK SESSION

The meeting was **called to order at 9:00 a.m.**

Agenda Item #1, T Mobile Site (PO02342A): Removed from the agenda.

Agenda Item #2, Review ARPA Fund Uses and Requirements: Account Manager Janet Pritiskutch discussed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds with the Court. The funds must be designated by the end of 2024 but do not have to be spent until 2026, giving the County time to make determinations as to how the funds will be expended. The funds may only be spent according to regulations put forth by the government. Ms. Pritiskutch discussed mandatory reporting requirements for the funds once they are received.

Agenda Item #3, Review Meal Per Diem: Account Manager Janet Pritiskutch requested the Courts input on whether the meal per diem for County employees should be increased. The meal per diem was increased in 2018 to \$42 per day however, some employees, especially those travelling outside of Oregon, are finding that \$42 is not sufficient. The Court will review the daily meal per diem amount and adjust accordingly for out of state travel.

Agenda Item #4, Legislative Update re Accessory Dwelling Units and Wildfire Risk Mapping: Will VanVactor and Brent Bybee of Community Development appeared before the Court to discuss two Senate Bills passed by the Oregon Legislature that may impact land use planning and policies in Crook County. Senate Bill 391 authorizes the County to permit accessory dwelling units in rural residential areas, though certain requirements must be met. Senate Bill 762 will require the Oregon Department of Land Conservation to update the state land use planning program, local comprehensive plan and zoning codes needed to minimize wildfire risks. Both Senate Bills will be reviewed by the County Planning Commission before the County Court makes any decisions.

At 10:03 a.m. the Court read into Executive Session under the following statute(s): ORS 192.660(2)(e) For the purpose of conducting deliberations with persons designated by the governing body to negotiate real property transactions.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At the conclusion of the Executive Session, the County Court convened back into Open Session, inviting members of the public into the meeting room.

REGULAR SESSION

The meeting was **called to order at 9:00 a.m.**

MOTION to approve the Consent Agenda as presented with the removal of item number ten. Motion seconded. No discussion. Motion carried 3-0.

Discussion item #12: The Road Department is interested in purchasing a new HX 520 dump truck pursuant to an interstate cooperative procurement agreement. The agreement would be through Sourcewell, which the County is a member of. This would entitle the County to a discount off the purchase price of \$183,144, the discounted price is estimated to be \$10,000. The purchase of the dump truck is within budget for the Road Department and was approved by County Court.

MOTION to approve purchase of new dump truck pursuant to Sourcewell Interstate Cooperative price agreement 060920. Motion seconded. No further discussion. Motion carried 3-0.

Discussion item #13: The Landfill is interested in purchasing a 966 M-BR model Caterpillar Wheel Loader through an interstate cooperative procurement agreement. The agreement would be via Sourcewell which may offer the County a non-guaranteed price agreement. The price of the wheel loader is \$445,821.47, which is within the Landfill's budget. Tires and wheels would need to be purchased separately for the wheel loader. County Court approved the purchase of a 966 M-BR model Caterpillar Wheel Loader for the Landfill.

MOTION to approve the purchase of a 966 M-BR model Caterpillar Wheel Loader pursuant for Sourcewell through Petersen Machinery. Motion seconded. No further discussion. Motion carried 3-0.

Discussion item #14: The Counties agreement with the State for the Juvenile Department to receive funding for prevention programs for at risk youth expired on June 30th. The State has proposed a grant instead of an agreement to fund future prevention programs. The issue with a grant is the State may not pay the County the entire \$63,000, if the State feels there is not enough money, and the grant requires the County to maintain insurance. While there are now conditions to receiving State funds for the Juvenile Department prevention programs the County Court is comfortable accepting these terms.

MOTION to approve youth development funding IGA. Motion seconded. No further discussion. Motion carried 3-0.

Discussion item #14A: The Road Department would like to purchase a Ford F350 pick-up for \$38,256.65 from Roberson Ford. Price quotes were requested from Roberson Ford, Wright Ford and TS&S, with quotes only being received from Roberson Ford. Funds for the pick-up are within the Road Departments budget. County Court approved the Road Departments request.

MOTION to approve \$38,256.64 to Roberson Ford for an F350 pick-up. Motion seconded. No further discussion. Motion carried 3-0.

At 9:17 a.m. the Court convened into Executive Session under the following statute(s): ORS 192.660(2)(d) To conduct deliberations with persons designated by the governing body to carry on labor negotiations.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Enclosed is Agreement for Improvements to Public Internet Connectivity (Agreement) with the Prineville Downtown Association (PDA). PDA is the recipient of certain grant funds, a portion of which is to be used to enhance the public internet availability in Prineville. Through this agreement, the County will develop the scope and either undertake or contract for internet improvements to the library, Bowman Museum, and fairgrounds. The Agreement is written such that we will continue with the projects to the extent there grant money available to complete the job.

Troy Poncin recommends its approval and has prepared the orders for some of the needed equipment. Please let me know if you have any questions.

AGREEMENT FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO PUBLIC INTERNET CONNECTIVITY

This Agreement for Improvements to Public Internet Connectivity (the “Agreement”) is made by and between the Prineville Downtown Association, an Oregon non-profit corporation (hereinafter “PDA”) and Crook County, a political subdivision of the State of Oregon (hereinafter “County.”) Collectively, PDA and County may be referred to as the Parties, or individually as a Party.

RECITALS

- A. *Whereas*, PDA is the recipient of a certain grant, a portion of which is earmarked for public internet connectivity projects; said portion shall be referred to hereafter as the “Grant Funds”; and
- B. *Whereas*, County has the means to implement the development of additional public internet availability in the Prineville area; and
- C. *Whereas*, the Parties wish to cooperate together as described herein to advance the purposes of the grant and increase the availability of internet services to the general public.

AGREEMENT

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Term: This Agreement is effective on the date when signed by both Parties and terminates upon expenditure of all Grant Funds or one year from the date of execution, whichever happens sooner, unless terminated pursuant to other provisions of this Agreement.
- 2. Adoption of Recitals: The above Recitals are adopted into and made a part of this Agreement, as terms of contract and not mere recitals.
- 3. PDA’s Responsibilities: PDA will perform the following services.
 - a. Grant management: PDA will undertake and perform those duties as may be contemplated for acceptance and expenditure of the Grant Funds, including but not limited to any progress reporting and implementation of financial controls.
 - b. Reimbursement of expenses: PDA will reimburse County for County’s actual expenses within thirty (30) days of receipt of County’s invoice. County will provide PDA with such information related to its expenses as PDA may reasonably request.

c. Cooperation during development: PDA will reasonably cooperate with County during the development and installation of the project equipment; provided, however, that PDA will not be responsible for more than *de minimis* out-of-pocket expenses. PDA will also advise County, as the scope and developments progress, of remaining Grant Funds available.

4. County's Responsibilities: County will perform the following services. The responsibilities listed in subparagraphs e. through g. are subject to the availability of sufficient Grant Funds.

a. Expense tracking: County will maintain such records as may be necessary to document its actual expenses incurred in the course of this project. These actual expenses will include but not be limited to the costs for supplies, equipment, third party contractor's expenses, and County staff time. County staff time will be billed at the rate of the staff's gross hourly wage.

b. Development of project scope and timeline: County will develop a scope and estimated timeline for the implementation of publicly available internet connectivity.

c. Staffing and engaging with third party contractors: County will undertake the project with either its staff or through engaging with third party contractors. Subject to PDAs' obligations to pay County's expenses as described herein, County will be responsible for paying such wages, benefits, and contractors' fees as may be incurred.

d. BOLI registration and specialty code permitting: County, either directly or through third party contractors, will be responsible for obtaining such permits and licenses as the project installation may require, the costs for which will be included in County's actual expenses. Further, if required by law, County will be responsible for complying with the public works and public improvement requirements of the Bureau of Labor and Industries, including, to the extent applicable, payment of wages, submission of WH-81 form, and notification to the Bureau of Labor and Industries.

e. Library: County may acquire and install such equipment as to increase the publicly available internet throughput, network management, and area of wi-fi coverage both inside the Library and outside on the Library grounds.

f. Bowman Museum: County may acquire and install such equipment as to increase the publicly available internet throughput, network management, and area of wi-fi coverage inside the Bowman Museum complex. County will install outside wireless access points and antenna in the vicinity of the Museum.

g. Fairgrounds: County may acquire and install such equipment as to expand the current Fairgrounds wi-fi coverage, to increase bandwidth, and increase network management. This may include, but not be limited to, the engagement of a third party contractor to install fiber and related equipment.

h. Invoices: County will submit to PDA up to six (6) invoices, for the following services:

- One (1) invoice upon the completion of the Library project or exhaustion of Grant Funds.
- One (1) invoice upon the completion of the Bowman Museum project or exhaustion of Grant Funds.
- Up to four (4) invoices for the Fairgrounds project. It is currently anticipated that these invoices will cover (a) initial hardware purchases; (b) the costs for fiber installation and related services; (c) costs associated with other installation or equipment purchases; and (d) any other project expenses.

6. Termination: Upon material breach, either Party may terminate this Agreement upon ninety (90) days' prior written notice to the other Party. Termination or expiration of this Agreement will not prejudice any right or claim which accrues prior to such termination or expiration.

7. Use of Right of Way: For the duration of this Agreement, PDA grants to County permission to occupy and operate within PDA's rights-of-way and property as may be reasonably necessary to perform the services under this Agreement. At the completion of the project, County will restore such PDA rights-of-way and properties to the same condition as existed before the work began.

8. Assignment: Neither this Agreement nor any of the rights granted by this Agreement may be assigned or transferred by either Party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, County may engage the services of subcontractors for some or all of the work described herein, provided, however, that County will remain responsible to PDA for the completion of the services.

9. Binding Effect: The terms of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of each of the Parties and each of their respective administrators, agents, representatives, successors, and assigns.

10. Agency and Partnership: Neither Party is, by virtue of this Agreement, a partner or joint venturer with the other Party and neither Party shall have any obligation with respect to the other Party's debts or liabilities of whatever kind or nature.

11. Indemnification:

- a. To the extent permitted by Article XI, Section 10, of the Oregon Constitution and the Oregon Tort Claims Act, ORS 30.260 through 30.300, PDA shall defend, save, hold harmless, and indemnify County and its officers, employees, and agents from and against all claims, suits, actions, losses, damages, liabilities, costs, and expenses of any nature resulting from or arising out of, or relating to the activities of PDA or its officers, employees, contractors, or agents under this Agreement.

- b. To the extent permitted by Article XI, Section 10, of the Oregon Constitution and the Oregon Tort Claims Act, ORS 30.260 through 30.300, County shall defend, save, hold harmless, and indemnify PDA and its officers, employees, and agents from and against all claims, suits, actions, losses, damages, liabilities, costs, and expenses of any nature resulting from or arising out of, or relating to the activities of County or its officers, employees, contractors, or agents under this Agreement.
- c. Neither party shall be liable to the other for any incidental or consequential damages arising out of or related to this Agreement. Neither party shall be liable for any damages of any sort arising solely from the termination of this Agreement or any part hereof in accordance with its terms.

12. Non-Discrimination: Each Party agrees that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, marital status, age, or sexual orientation, suffer discrimination in the performance of this Agreement when employed by either Party. Each Party agrees to comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 as amended, Section V of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 as amended, and all applicable requirements of federal and state civil rights and rehabilitation statutes, rules, and regulations. Additionally, each Party shall comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 as amended, ORS 659.425, and all regulations and administrative rules established pursuant to those laws.

13. Attorney fees: In the event an action, lawsuit, or proceeding, including appeal therefrom, is brought for failure to observe any of the terms of this Agreement, each Party shall bear its own attorney fees, expenses, costs, and disbursements for said action, lawsuit, proceeding, or appeal.

14. No Waiver of Claims: The failure of either Party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver by that Party of that provision or of any other provision of this Agreement.

15. Severability: Should any provision or provisions of this Agreement be construed by a court of competent jurisdiction to be void, invalid, or unenforceable, such construction shall affect only the provision or provisions so construed, and shall not affect, impair, or invalidate any of the other provisions of this Agreement which shall remain in full force and effect.

16. Applicable Law: This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon, with venue reserved for the Circuit Court of Crook County.

17. Entire Agreement: This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties concerning the subject matter hereof, and supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements or understandings between the Parties, if any, whether written or oral, concerning the subject matter of this Agreement which are not fully


expressed herein. This Agreement may not be modified or amended except by a writing signed by both Parties.

18. **Counterparts:** This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, including electronically transmitted counterparts, which when taken together shall constitute one and the same original. Facsimiles and electronic transmittals of the signed document shall be binding as though they were an original of such signed document.

The County is undertaking repairs on a bridge along Weigand Road, and the Central Oregon Irrigation District requires the County to obtain an easement agreement from them. Under this agreement, the County is permitted to work in the district's right of way, in exchange for certain commitments such as one-sided indemnity and the duty to pay for COID's costs in reviewing any changes in plans. The County will also install certain equipment in the canal channel. The Road Department has reviewed the terms and recommends the approval.

BRIDGE & EASEMENT CROSSING AGREEMENT

Parties: Central Oregon Irrigation District ("COID")
 Crook County ("County")
 Effective Date: _____, 2021 ("Effective Date")

RECITALS

A. County is removing an existing bridge and constructing a new bridge and other minor associated appurtenances (the "Improvements") located on Weigand Road, County Bridge #13C24, located at Township 15 South (T15S), Range 14 East (R14E), Section 24 southwest corner of the SE ¼ NE ¼ in Crook County (the "Property"). COID holds an easement for its Main Canal over the Property. COID also holds easements for lateral canals in Crook County, Oregon (the "Lateral Easements"). **See Exhibit A.**

B. COID's easement over the Property (the "Easement") and the Lateral Easements are for installation, operation, maintenance, repair, and improvements (collectively "Operations") of an irrigation canal, pipeline, penstock, or other infrastructure (the "Facilities").

C. County is constructing the Improvements at its expense over and within the Easement and Lateral Easements pursuant to a set of plans and specifications, shown on the attached **Exhibit B** it has submitted to COID for approval in advance of beginning construction (the "Plans").

D. County and COID desire to set out the terms and conditions that will apply between the parties during the construction and operation of the Improvements.

E. County and COID have agreed that County's construction and installation of the Improvements shall be as set forth in the Plans, pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

In consideration of the covenants and conditions set forth in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Agreement to Construct and Maintain Improvements.** County agrees to construct and install the Improvements within and over the Easement and Lateral Easements, in accordance with the Plans and the terms and conditions of this Agreement (County's "Work"). The location of the Easement, Lateral Easements, and the Improvements are depicted on the attached Exhibits A and B. County agrees to maintain and repair the Improvements in accordance with generally accepted road and bridge industry practices and maintain the Improvements in good and working order.

1.1 Any deviation in construction from the Plans that may reasonably impact COID's Operations must first be approved by COID's general manager, in writing, after undergoing third-party engineering review at County's expense.

1.2 Any replacement of the Improvements requires renewed agreement between the parties, which shall not be unreasonably withheld by COID. Such authorization shall be memorialized in an amendment to this Agreement or a new bridge crossing agreement. To the extent all or a portion of the replacement Improvements are identical to the original Improvements they replace, COID will not require an engineering review for the identical structural elements. However, COID must still review any plans related to the removal of the original Improvements and the construction of the replacement Improvements. County agrees to reimburse COID its actual costs for any professional services incurred in connection with the authorization of such replacement Improvements.

2. **Easement Use Rights.** The parties acknowledge and agree that, except as specifically set forth herein, this Agreement does not grant County any rights to use the Easement or Lateral Easements. This Agreement is not intended to diminish COID's rights under the Easement or Lateral Easements or to adversely impact COID's rights under local, state, or federal law or contract. COID grants County permission to access the Easement during construction for purposes of rebuilding the Weigand Bridge at no cost to County. COID agrees to allow roadway slopes and other roadway features of the Project to encroach on COID'S easement, as shown in Exhibit B, and hereby grants County the right to enter onto and occupy COID's easement for performance of construction, so long as these encroachments do not interfere with COID's operations, including maintenance and repair responsibilities.

3. **Notice of Construction; Inspection.** County shall notify COID when construction and installation of the Improvements is ready to commence so that COID field staff and engineer can be available to review and inspect the Improvements' installation plan and schedule. At such time that the Work is ready for final inspection, County will call COID field staff and engineer to inspect the final Improvements. COID reserves the right to require County to make reasonable changes to ensure that the construction or installation has occurred in accordance with the Plans, and to ensure that the construction or installation does not impair COID's Facilities or Operations.

4. **Blast and Boring Plans,** if any, for the Work shall be provided to COID's engineer prior to work near the Easements or Lateral Easements. COID's engineer shall be provided blast test information by County for any blasting that approaches the COID Easement or Lateral Easements, for review and approval by COID.

5. **County Responsible for Improvements.** County agrees that all construction and maintenance of any Improvements or other work, facilities, or structures contemplated by this Agreement shall be the responsibility of County. County will incorporate the replacement of the lateral irrigation pipes into the designs for the replacement of Weigand Bridge, as reflected in Exhibit B, sheet 2. The cost of all pipe and fittings, including installation, related to the project will be borne by County. The parties will reasonably coordinate the timing of the placement of the lateral pipes. COID will be responsible for installation of headgates, vaults, and measuring devices associated with the new piping. This paragraph does not require County to perform maintenance on any of COID's Facilities, except that the County is responsible for repairs as provided in Section 11.

6. **Impediments and Encroachments Prohibited.** This Agreement allows County to install, construct, and maintain the Improvements shown in the Plans, in the ground under, over and within COID's Easement. County agrees it will not place, install, or build anything not described in the Plans within the Easement or Lateral Easements as part of its Work. This Agreement does not purport to establish the limits or extent of COID's Easement or Lateral Easements either vertically or horizontally.

7. **COID Activity in Easement.** The parties agree that:

7.1 COID shall conduct its operations in the Easement and Lateral Easements in a safe and competent manner so as not to interfere with the Improvements. COID further agrees that it will provide reasonable advance notice to County before undertaking any work in the Easement or Lateral Easements that may impact the Improvements, but COID is not required to obtain County's permission before commencing any work under this section. COID need not provide advance notice for routine maintenance activities.

7.2 In the event of an emergency that requires COID to undertake immediate work that may impact the Improvements, COID will provide County with notice of the emergency. Upon receiving notice, the parties will work together in good faith to balance the competing interests and to develop an emergency action plan to address the COID emergency as quickly as possible.

8. **County Activity in its Improvements.** The parties agree that:

8.1 County shall conduct its operations of the Improvements in a safe and competent manner so as not to interfere with COID's Facilities. County further agrees that it will provide reasonable advance notice to COID before undertaking any work in the Improvements that may impact COID's Facilities, but County is not required to obtain COID's permission before commencing any work under this section. County need not provide advance notice for routine maintenance activities.

8.2 In the event of an emergency that requires County to undertake immediate work that may impact COID's Facilities, County will provide COID with notice of the emergency. Upon receiving notice, the parties will work together in good faith to balance the competing interests and to develop an emergency action plan to address the County emergency as quickly as possible.

9. **Waiver of Claims for Damage to Improvements.** County agrees to waive any claims against COID, its officers, directors, employees, representatives, agents, successors and assigns ("COID Parties"), and hold the COID Parties harmless in perpetuity for any and all claims or damages arising out of damage to the Improvements as a result of COID's Operations within the Easement, except to the extent that such claims and damages are caused by the COID Parties' own negligence or wrongful acts or omissions.

10. **Indemnity.** County agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the COID Parties from, for and against any and all claims, damages, expenses, costs, fees (including reasonable attorney fees and court costs, engineering fees, and other professional fees), fines, liabilities, losses, penalties, proceedings, and suits, including losses associated with interrupted irrigation or stock water deliveries or interrupted hydropower generation (collectively, the "Exposure") arising from or caused by any act, omission, or negligence by County's elected officials, agents, employees, invitees, and contractors in County's use, occupation, management, or control of the Improvements, except to the extent that such exposure is caused by the COID Parties' own negligence or wrongful acts.

11. **No Interference with COID Operations.**

11.1. County agrees to construct, operate, and maintain the Improvements in a safe and competent manner, so as not to interfere with COID's Operations, including its ability to deliver water through the Facilities.

11.2. In the event that County damages COID's Facilities or the area within the Easement or Lateral Easements through the exercise of its rights under this Agreement, County shall be responsible for immediately repairing such damage.

11.3. County acknowledges that COID's Irrigation Season is from April 1 to and through October 31 and that COID makes short winter stock runs. It is County's responsibility to obtain winter delivery schedules and understand that these dates may change unexpectedly. No work that negatively impacts COID Facilities is allowed between April 1 and the end of irrigation season. No work is to be done under this Agreement that contaminates the water of COID or that restricts the water flow of COID during the irrigation season (April 1 to October 31 of each year). All work shall be scheduled in such a manner as to permit five (5) day winter stock runs in COID canals or as directed by COID during the non-irrigation season (November 1 through March 31 of each year). Project construction shall be completed no later than March 31, 2022. Any deviation from the Plans requires additional coordination between County and COID to minimize disruptions to COID's irrigation obligations.

12. **Force Majeure.** For any major natural disaster beyond the reasonable control of the parties, which despite the exercise of due diligence the party could not reasonably have been expected to avoid and by the exercise of due diligence it is unable to overcome, which may include but is not limited to, fire, flood, volcano, or earthquake ("Force Majeure"), which causes a disruption or impact to the COID Facilities and

County's Improvements, the parties shall be excused from their obligations under this Agreement to the extent and for the duration of the event of Force Majeure, after which such party shall recommence performance of such obligations.

13. **Attorney Fees.** If any dispute arises concerning the interpretation or enforcement of this Agreement, each party shall bear its own costs and attorney's fees.

14. **Successors and Assigns.** Unless terminated as provided in Section 16, this Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective executors, administrators, successors-in-interest and assigns. As used in this section, "successors-in-interest" shall refer to the successors to all or substantially all of a party's assets and to their successors by merger or consolidation.

15. **Fees.** COID waives its standard crossing fees for this Agreement.

16. **Amendment; Termination.** The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall not be waived, altered, modified, supplemented, or amended in any manner whatsoever without prior written approval of the parties hereto, as evidenced by execution of a written recorded instrument. This Agreement may be terminated by mutual agreement of the parties hereto, evidenced by execution of a written recorded instrument.

17. **Choice of Law; Venue.** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of Oregon as interpreted by the Oregon courts. The exclusive venue for any litigation arising under this Agreement shall be in the Circuit Court for Crook County, Oregon unless the parties agree otherwise. However, the parties may attempt to resolve any dispute arising under this Agreement by any mutually agreeable means of dispute resolution.

18. **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which, when taken together, shall constitute fully executed originals. Facsimile or email signatures shall operate as original signatures with respect to this Agreement.

19. **Notice.** All notices or other communications required or permitted by this Agreement, shall be in writing and shall be deemed given when personally delivered, or in lieu of personal service, three (3) days after deposit in the United States mail, first class, postage prepaid, certified, or the next business day if sent by reputable overnight courier, provided receipt is obtained and charges prepaid by the delivering party, addressed as follows, or to any other address as a party may designate:

20. **No Agency, Partnership or Joint Venture.** Neither the County nor COID, by virtue of this Agreement, is a partner or joint venture with the other party in connection with the activities carried out under this Agreement.
21. **No Third Party Beneficiaries.** County and COID are the only parties to this Agreement and are the only parties entitled to enforce its terms. Nothing in this Agreement gives, is intended to give, or shall be construed to give or provide any benefit or right, whether directly, indirectly or otherwise, to third persons.
22. **Recording.** This Agreement may be recorded at any time by COID, at COID's sole expense, in the real property records of Crook County.
23. **Construction.** The terms of this Agreement shall not be construed in favor of or against either party based on authorship, but shall be construed as if both parties prepared this Agreement.
24. **Captions; Headings.** Section headings are for ease of reference only and should not be used in constructing or interpreting this Agreement.
25. **Severability.** In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, article or other portion of this Agreement shall become illegal, null or void or against public policy, for any reason, or shall be held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, null or void or against public policy, the remaining portions of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in force and effect to the fullest extent permissible by law.
26. **Legal Counsel.** The parties acknowledge that each has obtained the advice of legal counsel in connection with its review and execution of this Agreement.
27. **Waiver.** No waiver by either party of a breach of any of the terms, covenants or conditions of this Agreement by the other party shall be construed or held to be a waiver of any succeeding or preceding breach of the same or any other term, covenant or condition herein contained.
28. **Authority.** Each individual signing on behalf of a party to this Agreement states that he or she is the duly authorized representative of the signing party and that his or her signature on this Agreement has been duly authorized by, and creates the binding and enforceable obligation of, the party on whose behalf the representative is signing.

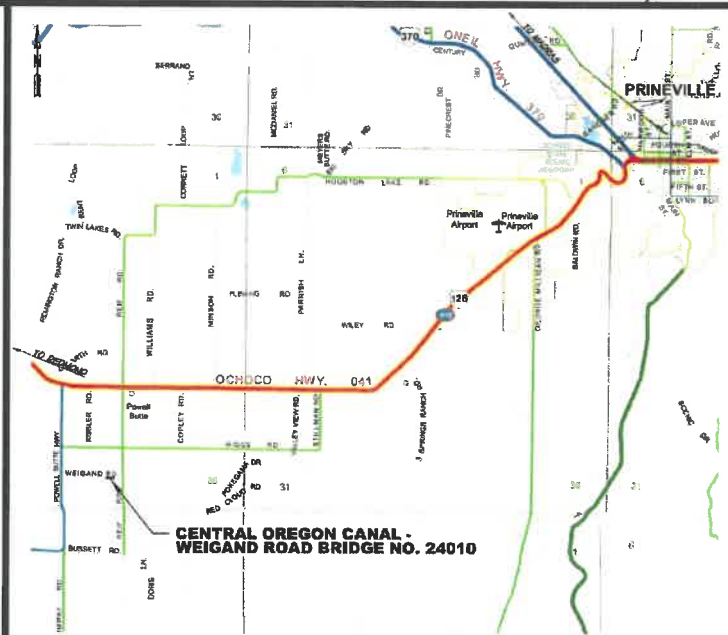

Speed, resolution, and fancy technical features are not as important to the department as basic reliability and prompt customer service. The department's printer vendor has been Pacific Office Automation (POA) since at least the purchase of their prior printer eleven years ago, and the department has been very pleased with POA's service. Also, despite the Xerox C7030 being the cheapest option, delivery for that unit would be roughly five to six weeks out, versus one to two weeks for POA's Cannon C5840i. The features and performance of the two units are roughly similar.

Considering the similar performance, known customer service, and much quicker delivery timeline, the department believes POA's \$171.05 per month quote for the Cannon C5840i represents the quote that best serves the interest of Crook County. Debbie Patterson recommends

If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Approval of this measure authorizes the County to issue general obligation bonds in a principal amount up to \$35 million. Use of proceeds would be audited and publicly disclosed.

The County does not intend or expect to impose an additional property tax to pay the bonds, but seeks general obligation bond authority to obtain the lowest interest rate financing option.

Proceeds of the bonds would pay capital costs to help provide a new Justice Center and related facilities and to restore the existing courthouse.

Specifically, the Justice Center is expected to:

- improve capacity for speedy trials;
- consolidate and expand access to public services;
- provide increased safety and privacy for jurors, the public, and employees; and
- open space for the restoration of the courthouse.

County is seeking other sources of revenues to help fund the courthouse renovation and the Justice Center, and will also receive State matching funds.

The bonds may be issued in series, with each series maturing within 25 years.
