After reading it I contacted DOGAMI. I explained I complained in the past and quoted what was said to me. DOGAMI only handles complaints if something from the blast site hits your home... nothing else. Our edited conversations are below. Please note I never received a response to my last email from DOGAMI.

Louis Seals states no "SIGNED" complaints. That does not mean zero complaints. Also he said notices are sent by planning. Not true. I can provide the Green Bar envelope which is hand written.

We were in Portland and could not attend the hearing (we were never notified about). I would have shared what our neighbor told us (when we asked about the September, 2020 blast) that they "fought the quarry and won"... and he asked confused "why are they blasting again??" They have since moved away.

Someone needs to look into what happened after the CUP was denied, challenged and denial upheld. Can DOGAMI do this? If so it makes sense why the applicant isn't applying for a CUP.....

Taking a lot in a subdivision (highest fire risk) and turning it into an addition to the quarry next door (operator without a permit no less) that is at or very near to reclamation, lying about the parcel being landlocked, not meeting the "significant" threshold...should be enough to deny this.
