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
EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Pinnacle Architecture was commissioned to survey and provide programming for numerous departments of Crook County, Oregon. It is the intent of this Report to provide guidance to Crook County with respect to current Department space requirements, preferred adjacencies, projections of future growth, and project budget for new Circuit Court Building.

Pinnacle conducted surveys and programming for each department. In addition, Pinnacle visited each physical department and walked the space with department heads or their designated representative. The information provided by each department helps in determining how each space functions, what works in the current space, and what deficiencies there are.

In conjunction with the department head meetings, individual staff members input was gathered and documented. This information is invaluable in determining how each department functions at a staff level and how space/department may work more efficiently.

FINDINGS

Based on the information gathered, compiled, and processed Pinnacle has made some assumptions on the best combination of departments. There are natural combinations of departments just based on their functions and day to day use. The Combined Program Exhibit A shows the entire program space by space and the following is a snap-shot of each department and some highlights. A previous study found that the existing Circuit Court and associated departments are deficient in almost all avenues of space and function. Security, technology, heating/ventilation and flow of people are the most evident.

Each one the following Programs includes spaces that typical buildings would require, IE mechanical rooms, electric rooms, restrooms etc... The gross factor shown on the summary sheet of each Program is used to account for hallways, walls, shafts, etc... that are found in typical buildings. Also, included are anticipated parking stalls needed to full fill the desired functions. Certain Departments require spaces like restrooms that cannot be shared due to the function of that department. However, upon further development of each Program there may be some area/square foot reductions for spaces that maybe easily shared.

- Victims Advocate

Findings by Department:

Circuit Court Findings

- Overlap of Judges, District Attorneys, Attorneys, inmates, jurors, public, and staff is problematic and not secure.
- Acoustical privacy is a concern.
- Security is a concern.
- Staff flow and adjacencies are not efficient.
- Lack of conference/meeting rooms.
- Lack of space for private Attorney meetings.
- No inmate hold rooms or secure areas for inmates.
- Access to public Law Library a concern.

District Attorney Findings

- Overlap of Judges, District Attorneys, Attorneys, inmates, jurors, public, and staff is problematic and not secure.
- Acoustical privacy is a concern.
- Security is a concern.
- Staff flow and adjacencies are not efficient.
- No consistent place for Grand Juries.

Victims Advocate Findings

- No area for growth of team.
- Lack of conference/meeting rooms.
- Security and secondary exit a concern.

Juvenile Department Findings

- No area for growth of team.
- Lack of conference/meeting rooms.
- Security and secondary exit a concern.
- Staff flow and adjacencies are not efficient.
- Dropoff/pick up for juveniles not ideal on such a public street.

Sheriff's Department Findings

- Lack of secure storage.
- No space for training/emergency response room
- Little space for future growth.

Community Corrections/Parole Findings

- Security at lobby a concern.
- Location of Work Crew dropoff/pick up not ideal.

Based on information gathered the following deficiencies or concerns were found to be similar from department to department.

- Antiquated heating and ventilation systems.
- Concerns about personal security.
- In efficient space planning.
- Lack of Conference/Training/Meeting rooms.
- No space for growth or even over grown spaces.
- Acoustical issues.

RECOMMENDATIONS/CONCLUSIONS

Based on the findings and projected needs of Crook County Pinnacle has the following recommendations.

The *Combined Program* shows that a new building would be in the best interest of the departments included and the Community as a whole. A new building would allow these departments to function more efficiently and allow more collaboration between departments. It would also provide needed upgrades to security and privacy. The basic program would be similar in scope to the recently built Jefferson County District Court Building.

We have included the *Combined Program* as Exhibit A to illustrate the required area needed for the proposed project which equates to an approximately 52,000 Square Foot building. Exhibit B is provided to show anticipated <u>total project cost</u> of approximately \$32.7 million.


